



In 1947, a shepherd stumbled upon a hidden cave along the shore of the Dead Sea. Concealed inside were ancient scrolls that had not been seen in 2,000 years.

This once-in-a-lifetime exhibit offers more than 600 items including the oldest known copies of the Hebrew Bible, iconic objects from everyday life, artifacts from Jerusalem's City of David and an actual 3-ton stone from Jerusalem's Western Wall.
